Preface To the First I.Q.A.C. Report

Women's College, Calcutta founded in 1937 is presently one of the oldest colleges for women in North Calcutta. In March 2007, the college was assessed by the NAAC peer team and was accredited with the B++ grade. The peer team deeply appreciated the efforts of different sections of the college for the progress of women, especially from lower socio-economic background. The team believed that the college has the potentiality to develop into a leading academic institution. They commended some noteworthy activities of the college such as:

- Degree programme in music being open to others.
- Book Bank facility.
- Compulsory Computer Literacy Certificate Programme.
- Decision making through involvement of teachers in various committees.
- Co-operative Credit Society to staff and needy students.
- Establishment of Srijan a community welfare organization.
- Insurance coverage to students.

We are happy to say that the above activities are still enthusiastically being continued.

The peer team has also made some recommendations for the upliftment of the college, one of which is to form an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (I.Q.A.C.) comprising of members both from within and outside the college. Consequently a cell has been formed in July, 2007, which is at present actively engaged in formulating a programme of development and setting parameters for its implementation to be monitored and supervised at every stage. The members of the Governing Body, the college staff and the students together are trying their level best to comply with the guide lines set by the IQAC for the prupose. This is the first compliance report of IQAC after the completion of a year since the visit of the NAAC peer team in March, 2007.

- The College is successfully running different courses at Degree level and now deserves to start the P. G. courses in some subjects in a phased manner.
- The College may consider to have some add-on courses like Nursing, Fashion-Designing, Interior Decoration, Event Management, Food Processing etc. along with existing courses as per the local requirement.
- Vocational Courses like Journalism and Mass Communication, Travel and Tour ism, Hotel Management etc. may be considered.
- Steps may be taken to open one Centre for P.G. Courses of the Netaji Subhas Open University for the benefit of the locality.
- Steps may be taken to construct a Hostel adjacent to the College for the convenience of the students.
- The Government of West Bengal and the College Management may initiate steps to fill up the vacant teaching positions and to regularize the services of temporary / part time teachers.
- The infrastructure of the College may be strengthened.
- The Teachers may be encouraged and enabled to involve themselves in research projects from U.G.C. and other funding organisations.
- Career Guidance and Counselling and Placement cell need to be revitalised.
- A Gymnasium may be constructed and U.G.C. assistance may be sought in this regard.
- Yoga and Karate training may be provided in the campus.

As per recommendations of the N.A.A.C. peer team the following plan of action was chalked out by the I.Q.A.C. in the beginning of the academic session 2007-2008 towards quality enhancement.

Add - on-Courses :

- (a) Nursing, Fashion Designing, Interior Decoration, Event Management etc. were not possible due to lack of infrastructure, and high expenses involved in these courses beyond the capacity of the students belonging to the middle class.
- (b) Call-centre training a five month course on "Personality Development and Communicative English" for the college students is to begin from the next academic session 2008-09 for which Franklyn Institute of Language was approached and a seminar was held on 01.02.08 by them as an awareness campaign on the subject. They have also promised to organize a campus interview of the successful candidates after the completion of the course.

□ Vocational Courses:

- (a) Due to the high expenses involved in courses like Travel and Tourism, Hotel Management etc., these could not be introduced. The course on Journalism and Mass communication, has already been introduced.
- (b) Applications have been forwarded for job oriented vocational training evening courses to the Department of Small Enterprise and Self Employment, Govt. of W.B. for opening crash / diploma vocational courses at the college for the benefit of the students. A proposal has also been sent to the W.B. Council of Technical Education to allow the college to act as an authorised study centre (evening) to provide job-oriented technical training for the youth.
- (c) A proposal has been sent to Vidyasagar University to open an evening course for the degree of LL.B (3/5 years) and also for P. G. Courses in Arts, Science and Commerce.

Study Centre at P.G. level of the Netaji Subhas Open University -

The College has been made a centre for the above university since July, 2007 for the benefit of the college students and the locality where post graduate degree & diploma courses in different subjects are being regularly taught. (Refer Prospectus of the college PP13-14 for details)

To fill up the vacant teaching posts-

Steps have been taken to fill up eleven existing vacant teaching posts. The list of vacancies is being attached herewith. Proposals have been sent to the competent authority for approval of posts in the new departments of Hindi, Psychology, Sociology, Food and Nutrition, both Hons, and General. Already four faculties in the departments of Political Science, Geography, Sanskrit and History have been appointed.

Strengthening of college infrastructure -

Proposal has been sent to U.G.C. under eleventh plan for necessary fund for the vertical extension of college building.

Minor Research Project under U.G.C. -

Two of the teachers from the Departments of Education & English have sent proposals for M.R.P. under 11th plan awaiting approval.

Career guidance and counselling and placement Cell-

A placement cell has been opened in the college in August 2007 for organizing career counselling, workshops and seminars for providing employment opportunities to the students from time to time. Bio-data are collected from outgoing final year students and are being sent to several Placement Agencies of Kolkata for the future employment in their respective

Construction of Gymnasium -

A proposal was sent to the Central and State Govts, for opening a gymnasium in the college premises but no positive response has been received as yet.

- An arrangement has been made with Franklyn Institute of Language, Shyambazar branch for a 5 month course on Personality Development and Spoken English for the students of the college, to begin from academic session 2008-09. After the completion of the course, they will arrange a campus interview.
- The Legal Aid clinic holds regular legal counselling sessions, affiliated and funded by the Govt. of W. B., Department of Law. In the session 2007-08, 16 cases were regis tered, out of which 14 cases were amicably settled. Presently, 2 senior advocates of Calcutta High Court & one counsellor are regularly attending the clinic.
- A feedback form containing overall rating of the college by the outgoing students is being distributed among them on a regular basis.
